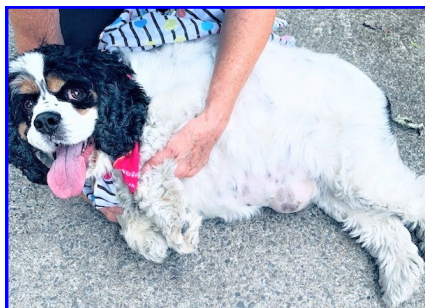

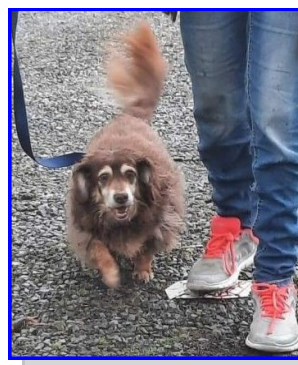
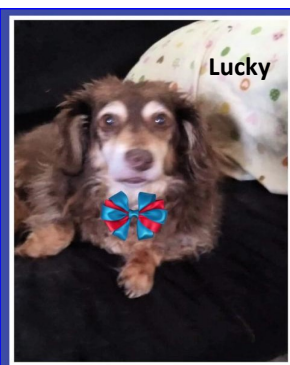
**GYPSY FINALLY HAS A LOVING PETPARENT, A CARING CHIHUAHUA BROTHER & AN INDOOR HOME!**

Someone reached out to a volunteer we know for help, & we arranged for her to go to the vet right away. She was diagnosed with heartworm, & we had her treated. She had several months of recovery of quiet time at a foster home. She looked swollen & overweight we think from the heartworms. After treatments, she appeared to be normal weight as the heartworms started to die off. When we rescue dogs, we have to treat many of them for heartworm. Yet an easy fix would have been if these dogs would have been on heartworm preventative all year at a previous home.

To make matters worse, Gypsy was found to have a bad abscessed tooth in her mouth & needed dental work really bad. Could you imagine the mouth pain she had probably endured for years. Well, we made sure the dental work was done. So it is wonderful now seeing her in the arms of a sensitive animal lover & new petparent who never wants her to be homeless ever again. He adopted Gypsy because his chihuahua was sad & kept sitting by the door waiting for his roommate's dog to appear after his roommate moved out. Now it's happy times again for both Gypsy and her new Chihuahua brother.

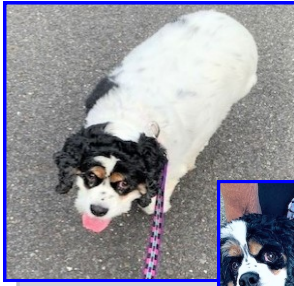


## **A LUCKY ANGEL!**

One of the volunteer driver's friend asked us for help with Lola. Her Petparent had died sadly leaving Her Mother with dementia and Her Beloved cocker spaniel Lola. Petmom had been the caregiver of her deceased Mom. And we can tell how much Petmom loved Lola, because she had a container filled with Lola's toys. Many times when she went to the store, she must have bought a toy for Lola. She had a big red and white Christmas stocking for Lola. We can't imagine how devastating it was for the Petparent to be worrying about Her Mom And Lola while she was battling the terminal illness. (We at Animal Sanctuary Society asked about the Mom with dementia who had to be placed in an assisted living facility. We asked would someone be keeping an eye on her. And we were told yes a cousin of Lola's Petparent. That cousin would have taken Lola into her home, but her own dog did not accept other dogs.)

(Lola's eight month health battle starts with getting many blood tests to get diagnosed to see if she has Cushing's disease which we suspected, getting the correct dose of meds for Cushing's disease, getting surgery and being on a diet, since she was more than double the weight she was supposed to be. Now she certainly deserves **The Biggest Loser Award** read below\*.)

\* When Lola arrived she went into a foster home. Right away we noticed a huge bump the size of a grapefruit on her belly. We took her to one of the vet hospitals we use. We told the vet that we suspected Lola had Cushing's disease, because we knew of other cockers that had it. They are always ravishingly hungry like Lola. The vet took basic blood work, and it showed that more tests were necessary because she could have Cushing's disease.

She had to stay at the vet for hours taking blood several times throughout. We got the results, but Cushing's was on the borderline. We waited a month and took her to get another blood test and got the same results. Results were delayed because the first special blood test the lab pick up company forgot to pick it up. It's was on ice, outside the vet for pick up again and again the lab company forgot it in the outside box at the vet. So Lola had to go back and be left at the vet again for several blood tests to be drawn throughout the day. That came back borderline again. It is not safe to give her meds for Cushing's disease unless she really has it. Meanwhile her vet who was going to do surgery on the large bump on the belly died of Covid.

We truly felt from our experience that Lola had Cushing's disease. We were determined to get to the bottom of this. We took her to another vet. That vet said it is very Important to take a series of blood within several hours and send that bloodwork to University of Tennessee Veterinary School. They test for five other hormones that if unbalanced can diagnose Cushing's disease.

She went through the series of blood work again and giving her certain injections throughout. It would take four weeks for results. We anxiously waited. We called our local vet to see where the results were since it was getting past waiting time.

But we found out the lab in Tennessee left her blood work on the shelf. She had to go through this blood work series and injections again. Four weeks later we finally got the results.

Our experience and determination paid off for Lola. Lola did have Cushing's as we suspected and was put on important special medicine probably for the rest of her life. Her luck has finally changed with our help. She had her surgery on the bump and it ended up being a large hernia because of her weight. We got her from the 46 lbs to the 23 lbs she was supposed to be. We got a wonderful loving couple to adopt her and they continue to care for her and give her her meds. Every night Lola climbs in with her petparents and snuggles up in bed. She must have done that to her previous Petmom.

We would look up to the heavens and talk to her previous deceased Petmom: "Don't worry we are taking care of Lola." And we certainly did!

Capri always wants to be close to Caleb (in the red vest), since he is blind in one eye and partially blind in the second. Even to the point of trying to squeeze on the same chair. 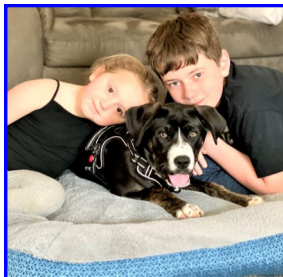


### **Nala is on her way to a fantastic life!**

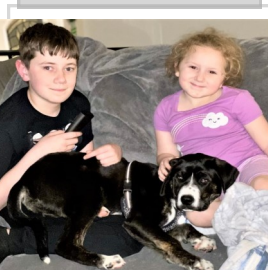

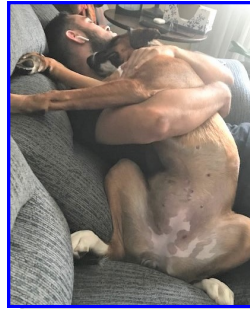

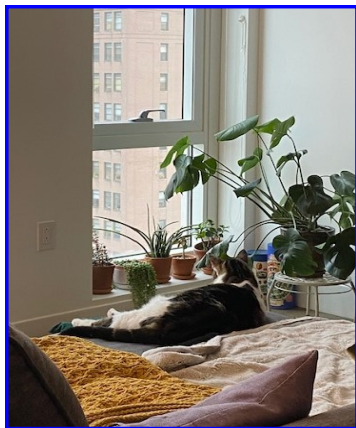

We posted Cam as needing a homebody, because he has extreme separation anxiety. We received an interest from his now Petmom that she has sight problems and is home a lot. We find her to be very caring and sensitive. She is in the childcare field. Her four year old son, her Mom and a Chihuahua live in a nice bi level home. Sadly Petmom had Lyme disease and it badly damaged her eye sight. When we saved Cam, he was just hours away from ending up in a high kill shelter due to lack of space. We heard his previous owner was going to bring him there because he could not keep him from leaving his property. Well he had to be neutered. That could have been the reason. Also if left alone outside, he will try to find you.

We placed him in a boarding kennel until we were able to get him to a vet. We found out he had heartworm. He was first neutered and then treated for heartworm. He was moved to a foster home for complete three weeks rest after treatment. He and his foster mom rested in the bedroom during that time, since his foster mom got a head injury at work and needed to rest for several weeks. It was there that he turned a regular dog crate upside down pulling curtains down through the crate when foster mom had to leave for one hour. When he came here, we had to use a non escape dog crate, because he would break out of a kennel run to always be with you. That's why it is wonderful he is now in his loving home being a close companion to his super caring and understanding Petmom. We drove his special non escape crate there so when the family does go out once in awhile he has it. He started to like his special crate with us, because he got a large knuckle bone when in there and loved having country music on in there as well. We would see his ears going towards the music. So we are thrilled that Cam is with a young woman with sight limitations and Her Son and Mom and Mom's Dog because the bond this Petmom will build with Cam will be very deep and special.
